Application Process

• Who may apply?

Applications are to be completed by the superintendent or immediate district-level supervisor of the corporation in which the principal is employed. Any individual who is currently employed as a public school principal in the state of Indiana is eligible for nomination. Priority is given to principals with three or more years of experience. Assistant principals, deans, department chairs, or other central office personnel are not eligible for IPLI.

• How will the applications be reviewed and scored?

The IPLI Director, along with a committee of mentors, an Advisory Board member, and a Leadership Team member will review the responses in each application. The applications will be reviewed so as to create a diverse group of principals, representing a wide range of student performance levels, demographics, and state regions.

Our Approach

IPLI is a two-year institute designed to address the professional needs of Indiana principals with an emphasis on student success. During the first year, the Institute will focus on increasing a principal's leadership capacity to address the current needs of his/her school in areas such as teacher evaluation models, student performance, community involvement, and shaping a strong school culture.

Near the mid-point of the first year, discussions will begin to shift toward building-level dynamics. While the focus will never be completely away from the individual principal, the interaction of personal and organizational capacities and goals will be addressed. A Personal Improvement Plan and a School Improvement Plan will be developed and continually revised throughout the two-year Institute.

Participation Includes:

- Mentoring by trained, highly-qualified mentors;
- Regional monthly focus-cohort meetings;
- Five seminars featuring nationally-recognized educational leaders including Nancy Dana, Todd Whitaker, Annette Breaux, Phil Warrick, and Tammy Heflebower;
- Access to resources to support the needs of principals and their schools including Marzano High Reliability Schools Network;
- Membership in the Indiana Association of School Principals and Ed Leaders Network;
- Registration for the IASP Fall Professionals Conference;
- An opportunity to enroll in 12 graduate credits toward the Indiana State University Educational Specialist's program at a significantly reduced tuition rate; and
- 45 Professional Growth Points (PGP) for each year of participation.
