#### **Background Leading to My Inquiry**

As a middle and high school principal, I spend a lot of time at extracurricular events. Some of the events I am required to attend and supervise, other events I choose to go to on my own. I felt that as much time as I spent at events outside of the regular school day, I wasn't really being intentional with my time and could use it more productively.

### The Purpose of My Inquiry

The purpose of my action research was to see if I engaged with others more during my time at extracurricular events, could I build better relationships with others, create new opportunities for students, and improve the culture of our school.

### **My Wondering**

With this purpose, I wondered if I spent time at school functions making better connections, could it improve our school? Could it create new opportunities for our students?

### My Actions


I started my project by looking at the events I was required to attend and supervise in Event link. I also wrote down all of the events I chose to attend. After each event, I kept a journal with a brief description of what I did at the event, new people I talked to, students I talked to, and any other notes I felt were important to include. I also sent an anonymous survey to parents to see their perception of me with both them and their student(s).

#### **Data Collection**

I collected data through Google calendar, Event link, journaling, notes, and a survey.

### My Data





I used Google calendar, my personal calendar, and Event link for events. I think journaled summaries after the events and included notes of discoveries. I sent out a survey to parents, however I was not able to send a follow up survey at the end of the year because of the pandemic. We had no spring events whatsoever for me to attend and therefore I did not feel the data would be accurate.

#### My Discoveries

- It is important to be approachable as a principal. This includes opening yourself up beyond your comfort zone at times.
- Investing in meaningful conversations can lead to wonderful, new opportunities.

It is important to be approachable as a principal. This includes opening yourself up beyond your comfort zone at times. I am fairly introverted when it comes to socializing at events. I realized through my date collection that only 81% of people thought I was approachable. In journaling, I noted that I talked with a group of students working the concession stand at a volleyball game. One of the girls was a junior and I had not spoken with her before. She told me that I always seem so serious and she was intimidated to talk to me. This was an eye-opener for me.

Investing in meaningful conversations can lead to wonderful, new opportunities. I talked to several parents at the events. I already know most of the parents, but I wanted to get to know more about them, as well as meet new people too. Though my journaling data, you can see that I formed two new committees by engaging with parents. I had a lunch meeting once a month with students where they would come in and eat lunch with me and share their ideas for improving our school. I also formed a parent-group that helped plan various activities and events for the students since we do not have a PTA. This group also helped with graduation even after school had been online for nine weeks.

### Where I Am Heading Next

By completing this project, I learned that in a small school it is important to be approachable to students, parents, and staff. I wear many hats in my position, but I need to be mindful of stepping away from the business of everyday tasks and engage in informal conversations with others.

In the future, I have set goals for myself. I plan to push myself to engage with others at events I attend. I plan to gain insight from others ideas and follow through with suggestions. I plan to have more fun! I want to create new opportunities that our school has not had before.

## My Actions

- I started by looking at the events I was required to supervise through a program called Event Link.
- I also noted the events I chose to attend.
- I journaled after each event a brief description of what I did at the event, new people I talked to, students I talked to, and any other notes I felt were important to include.
- I sent an anonymous survey to parents in the beginning to see their perception of me both with them and their student(s).
- My project was cut-short due to the pandemic. As a result I was not able to attend any spring events (most winter events ended in January). I did not send out a follow up survey at the end of the year to parents because I felt the data would be inconclusive since I only had one season of events I attended (as compared to most of the year).
- I reviewed the events and notes I collected and created this project with the information I had.



### My Data (Initial survey to parents)



81.4% felt I was approachable.

77.1% felt I was visible at events.

72.8% felt I was supportive of students in extracurricular events.

78.6% felt I support student engagement.

- Being quiet is not always a bad thing, but being too quiet can be misleading.
- I needed to visit more at school events. So many times when I am there, I do not socialize. I am so focused on the administrator role, I don't realize the fun you can have while doing the job. I also think I feared talking with parents would open the door to complaints and I felt by not interacting with them, I would not always have to hear the ways people want things done differently at the school.
- I got to know some great people! People who took tickets at the gate, students I joked with, and new families.
- I formed two new committees this past year from engaging in conversations with parents I approached.
- Taking the time to invest in meaningful conversations with others establishes great relationships and rapport.
- It is important to step outside your comfort zone at times!
